

PACIFIC COAST FOAM COMPLETES REPLICA OF JAIN SOCIETY TEMPLE FOR 2,500 BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION AT CHICAGO'S ROSEMONT CONVENTION CENTER

SAN DIEGO — September 4, 2001 —San Diego's largest supplier and installer of expanded polystyrene (EPS) foam architectural shapes and accents, recently completed an elaborate three-dimensional replica of an Jain Temple, which is located in the remote region of Bijar (see photo attached), according to Scott J. Buckley, vice president of sales and marketing for Pacific Coast Foam.

The Jain Temple, which measures 24' by 24' by 16' and set on a 2' high base, was designed and manufactured from EPS by Pacific Coast Foam and shipped to Chicago's Rosemont Convention Center, where it was used at an international meeting of more than 6,000 Jain Society religious members and religious leaders from throughout the world. The Temple was placed in a center water display with 24 water fountains around it. The display was designed to replicate the real Jain Temple, which is located in the middle of a lake in the Indian region of Bijar. The Temple is the place where the last "prophet" Mahavir gave his final sermon.

Key members of the design and manufacturing team included Dr. Nip Shah, who contracted PCF to design and fabricate the Temple replica, and Paul Shah of the Jain Society of San Diego; the Jain Society of Chicago; John Chandler Packaging; and Saturn Freight
