

PACIFIC COAST FOAM PROVIDES ARCHITECTURAL FOAM DETAILS FOR NEW VILLA HARVEY MANDEL APARTMENTS

SAN DIEGO — May 27, 2003 — Pacific Coast Foam (PCF) has provided the custom exterior architectural shapes and accents for the new Villa Harvey Mandel Apartments (see attached photo), located on the south side of Imperial Avenue between 16th and 17th streets, according to Scott J. Buckley, vice president of sales and marketing for PCF, San Diego's largest supplier and installer of expanded polystyrene (EPS) foam architectural shapes and accents.

PCF's innovative work includes the fabrication of a custom pre-coated decorative details made from its innovative Lykestone product, including “sandstone” window trim and sill details, stone corbel elements located underneath the bay “pop-out” windows, decorative stone bands and cornice stone molding with grout joints which run the along the buildings’ perimeter. The Villa Harvey Mandel Apartments are comprised of 90 low-income units. Pacific Coast Foam partnered with Standard Drywall of El Cajon, which performed the installation of the Lykestone elements on the seven-story building. St. Vincent de Paul is the owner of Villa Harvey Mandel Apartments and the architect was Jim Holberg and Don Reeves. The general contractor was Sundt Construction of San Diego.
